#### JANUARY BOARD HIGHLIGHTS:

#### **Restructuring of Foundation Board**

The Board of Directors for the Corporation in conjunction with the Foundation Board decided to restructure and expand the current Foundation Board of Directors. At the AGM it was voted on and decided to add two new members to the Foundation Board: Robert Taylor and Ellie Tureck. We will be adding an additional 2 members to the Foundation Board to be announced in February. The Foundation Board's mandate is to raise general funds for the improvement of the lives of the residents, and to raise funds for the Expansion Project.

The Board has approved the financials for both the Corporation and the Foundation. Both are doing significantly better, now that the interest rates have climbed back up.

The Board approved two major studies that are required for the Expansion Project, the Stormwater and Functional Services study and a Traffic impact Study. We will be sending these out for proposals from contractors and expect them to be completed in the spring or summer of this year.

The Board of Directors has approved a 5% increase to go into effect July 2025 for purchased meals and services at Legion Village. The chart on the last page reflects the increase.

#### STOOP AND SCOOP

Reminder to all pet owners that YOU are responsible for your pet. We have had some complaints of dogs barking while the owner is out for the day. Please be kind to the other residents and make sure the noise levels remain low. Please be aware that we have had complaints about owners not cleaning up after their pets. We have a station by the rec hall with animal waste bags. It is not Legion Village staff's responsibility to clean up after your pets.

Another gentle reminder to all residents to ensure that you always have your keys with you when entering or leaving the building. We maintain the equipment well, but sometimes it fails us and for that reason it is required that tenants always have their keys. We appreciate your co-operation with this matter.

#### **EXPANSION NEWS:**

We will be holding an information session on Tuesday February 18<sup>th</sup> at 9:45 during Coffee Morning in the Rec Hall to update everyone about the Expansion Project and to answer any questions residents and/or staff may have.

We are still trying to secure funding from all levels of Government but proceeding with the studies that are required by the Town of Cobourg and Northumberland County to move forward with our expansion.

We will be conducting Annual Fire Drills March 24-26<sup>th</sup> in the whole building. During these dates you will hear alarms going off. Please be aware if there was a real fire, staff would notify all residents if an evacuation were needed. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we conduct this mandatory training exercise.

We are in the process of updating the main door intercom systems. We have applied for a provincial grant to replace the systems at the main entrance and the entrance at Phase 3. Thank you for your patience as we try to update the system over the next few weeks.

We have received a Provincial Grant from Ontario Health East to update the flooring in the resident laundry rooms. This will give a much needed face-lift to those areas. The work will be completed over the month of February.
